A Report on Two- Day National Conference on Promoting Sustainability in Colleges and Villages organized by Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE) Ministry of Education, Government of India 21-22 March 2022

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Background

Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education as a Council under Ministry of Education, Government of India is striving hard to gain rural resilience through linkage of faculty and students of higher educational institutions with villages. In this regard MGNCRE is focusing on formation of Vocational Education/Rural/Social Entrepreneurship Development Cells across the higher educational institutions in the country and foster entrepreneurship spirit among the students. These cells provide a platform for the students to test their abilities and develop various skill sets to become successful entrepreneurs. In addition to that MGNCRE is also providing continuous inputs in gaining sustainability among the campus as well as the adopted village/s by the institutes. Sustainability practices focus on five important areas which include sanitation and hygiene, water management, waste management, greenery and energy conservation.

In this regard MGNCRE organized 5-day faculty development programs across the country and identified about 274 District Sustainability Mentors from those faculty development programs who can promote sustainability practices among the higher educational institutions and villages in their respective districts in the first phase.

Those selected 274 District Sustainability Mentors were allotted five colleges each in their respective districts to conduct five institute level offline workshops each on promoting institutional sustainability during the first and second week of March 2022.

A two day national level conference was organized by MGNCRE on 21st and 22nd March 2022 to understand and share the experiences of District Sustainability Mentors in promoting institutional sustainability. This national conference provided a platform for all District Sustainability Mentors to exchange their views on Campus and Village Sustainability Practices, Rural Immersion, way forward for linkage of faculty and students of higher educational institutions with villages.

A Conference where people from different places, different cultures and various traditions across the country joined together provided an enthralled experience for everyone. Spending time with people from other cultures allowed everyone to know what they struggle with and their traditions as a community. Further, such knowledge promotes personal growth while enabling to learn new things about different cultures.

Under the dynamic leadership of Dr W G Prasanna Kumar, Chairman of MGNCRE and with the support of core team, the two-day national conference on sustainability of colleges and villages was completed successfully providing all the participants rich learning experience, boosted their confidence in promoting sustainable practices among the institutions and villages leading to get internship, apprenticeship and entrepreneurship opportunities in their respective districts.

Inaugural Session

Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education organized a two-day National Conference on Promoting Sustainability in Colleges and Villages on March 21-22, 2022 at Baharat Ratna Nanaji Deshmukh Bhavan, JNV Campus Nallagandla in Hyderabad. MGNCRE is working with a noble vision of involving higher education curriculum in India in the process of building resilient rural India i.e., "Uthkrisht Gram for Unnat Bharat". Mission of this organization is to formulate and recognize curricular inputs and accredit courses and higher educational institutions, which enable development of sustainable, climate and disaster resilient rural livelihoods. This two-day National Conference was a step forward in this direction.

Inaugural Session on 21 March 2022 from 9.30 AM to 11 AM

The inaugural session of this National Conference was honoured with the auspicious presence of Dr. W.G. Prasanna Kumar, Hon'ble Chairman MGNCRE, Dr. C. Uma Maheshwar Rao, Ex-IAS officer and Member of Governing Council MGNCRE, Dr Nandita Pathak, Brand Ambassador of Swachh Bharat Mission, Social Entrepreneur and Dr. T Nagalakshmi, the Member Secretary of MGNCRE. The District Sustainability Mentors from around 13 states (Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Gujarat, Haryana, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, Telangana) were also present in this inaugural session.

Dr. T Nagalakshmi, in her welcome address, welcomed everyone from the core of her heart. She emphasized on doing one's own respective duties by quoting Robert Swan, a British Explorer, "The greatest threat to our planet is the belief that someone else will save it". She also cited the importance of this conference and how it is going to help the economy by abiding the action plan of MGNCRE.

The Hon'ble Chairman, **Dr W G Prasanna Kumar**, shared the genesis and the context and introduced the agenda of the conference in his address and highlighted the need of experiential learning in the present-day scenario. He also stressed on the need for creating Rural Internship opportunities for students. He also shared his thoughts about institutional sustainability and village level sustainable development plan, importance of integrating faculty and students of higher educational institutions with villages that help the rural entrepreneurs in getting potential inputs in scaling their business operations, identifying the scope for creation of employment opportunities through sustainable practices.

Dr Nandita Pathak who is a Social Entrepreneur and Brand Ambassador for Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and also who worked with Bharat Ratna Shri Nanaji Deshmukh ji shared her experiences in working with Chitrakoot Project, which is a self-reliance Program in 500 villages around Chitrakoot. It aimed at wiping out poverty, illiteracy, improving health, clean & green villages and creating dispute free



society. She highlighted the impact of her contributions towards dispute resolution, alleviation of Poverty, Unemployment, Illiteracy and malnutrition. She also shared her thoughts on how she encouraged Self-employment through training of thousands of women & youth especially of backward & downtrodden class, the way she guided

several thousand families for gainful employment through Micro finance, Self Help Group (SHGs) and Multi Level Employment Generation Programs (MLEGP). She linked her experiences with the role of district sustainability mentors towards gaining sustainability among higher educational institutions and villages. Dr. Nandita Pathak also said that any policy to solve some problem, solution should be formed with the participation of the people. For her, participation meant involvement of and initiation by the people themselves. She said that transparency is the key to the successful implementation of any policy. She also emphasized on the need for availability of water by saying that water brings prosperity.

Dr. C. Umamaheshwar Rao, MGNCRE Governing Council Member, explained in detail the relationship between science and spirituality by saying that there is no conflict between these two. To grow sustainable practices in the villages he emphasized on addressing several key problems such as



deforestation, land degradation, pollution and climate change which draw the immediate attention of the policy makers. He also shared his experiences and thoughts on handling sustainability aspects in higher educational institutions and enabling linkage between institutions and villages.

After the guests were honoured with a shawl and memento by the Chairman and Member Secretary, the vote of thanks was presented by the session anchor, **Smt. Padma Juluri**, Mentoring Faculty working with MGNCRE.

After the inaugural session all the DSMs were allotted separate rooms where the technical sessions were held.

Technical Sessions

Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Karnataka

Day 1: 11.30 AM to 7 PM

About 10 District Sustainability Mentors from Karnataka, 5 District Sustainability Mentors from Andhra Pradesh and 4 District Sustainability Mentors from Telangana took part in the two-day national conference on gaining sustainability in institutions and villages.

In the pre-lunch session each district sustainability mentor shared their experiences in conducting the institute level workshops on promoting sustainability in the areas of water management, waste management, sanitation and hygiene, greenery and energy conservation. This discussion helped the other delegates to understand their approach and mechanisms followed by each other in conducting programs.

This also helps in developing a Gram Panchayat Development Plan, conducting focused group discussions and interviews with rural public.





Day 2: 9.30 AM to 11 AM

A round table meeting was conducted to discuss the action plan of respective district sustainability mentors for involving faculty and students of higher educational institutions in rural immersion activity by following participatory rural appraisal techniques in addressing the rural concerns of respective adopted villages by the institutions. It helped every delegate in framing their action plan and planning their activities for next year course of action during the second day of national conference.

All the DSMs shared their individual experiences which they went through during the visits to higher education institutions in their districts. From these experiences a lot of positive outcomes which could be extended and implemented while working on making our villages sustainable and prosperous came to our notice:

- 1) Students can work as front-line workers during pandemics and disasters (covid, fire, flood etc.)
- 2) Herbal Gardening and medicinal plants gardening skills to the villagers
- 3) Practice of kitchen gardens
- 4) Rain water or roof top water harvesting
- 5) Community awareness programmes on:
 - a. Education
 - b. Women Empowerment
 - c. Sanitation
 - d. Awareness about government schemes
 - e. Electric vehicles
 - f. solar panels
- 6) Recycling of water
- 7) Social work for public constructions
- 8) Entrepreneurship and skill development in the villages
- 9) Allotment of responsibilities to the different groups so that accountability could be fixed
- 10) Installation of solar lights, solar water heaters
- 11) Recycling of paper waste and turning it into paper craft
- 12) Recharging bore wells through soak pits
- 13) Installing sanitary pad vending machine and incinerator in schools
- 14) Rich library
- 15) Continuous observation and maintenance of the initiatives taken in the past
- 16) Establishment of seed banks and creating the habit of making balls
- 17) Establishing bio-resource centre and production of compost
- 18) Mushroom cultivation
- 19) Fine for car/bike washing in water scarce areas
